Osprey Atmos 65 Backpack

I have to say so far I am very impressed with my Osprey pack! It's almost hard to even know where to begin...perhaps my favorite feature is the space between the mesh that is against my back and the central compartment of my back where I'm able to hang my water bladder. The pack then has a small opening on either the right or the left for the hydration hose to come out so I don't need to stop to get a water bottle out when I'm thirsty!

Another feature I really enjoy are the pockets on the hip-belt. Perfect for keeping my camera so I'm able to take pictures often. The other pocket is a good spot for a powerbar, chapstick, watch, etc. the kind of things you don't want to have to take your pack off to get at.

As for the compartments on the backpack, there is a convenient lower section that has a separate zipper access where I keep my tent. Since that is the first thing that goes up each night it is nice to be able to get at it without taking anything else out of my pack and since it is one of my heavier items I am able to keep it at the bottom of the pack. The main compartment above that holds the majority of the rest of my gear. There are two large zipper pockets on the outside back of the pack which are nice for the clothes that I use to layer with. These are items i take on and off all day and the eazy access to these outside pockets keeps me from having to dig through the rest of my pack.

The packs overall weight is relatively low as well. Since weight is such an important factor in backpacking it's important not to have the backpack itself take up a large chunk of the weight you are carrying! My Osprey pack is light weight but still offers all of the convenient features that any other pack can offer. I highly recommend this pack for any length of backpacking trip; overall I am very pleased!
