**6/14** I have a drinking problem. If I'm running on trails in the woods, water fountains aren't exactly plentiful. I don't want to hold onto anything or wear a dorky hip belt, so how do I obey my thirst? Thankfully, I found out about the Osprey Rev 6 (\$100), a super-lightweight hydration pack made expressly for runners and cyclists. What makes it a no-brainer for trail running in particular is the hip stabilizers: They're large and pliable enough to wrap around your flanks almost like a shirt, which means zero bouncing. Even better, the re-designed hydration bladder is easier to take apart and clean without spilling water all over yourself. Mountain bikers might opt for one of the bigger sizes, but for me the smallest model is plenty – the 1.5-liter bladder carries enough water to get me through all the wrong turns I can botch. Which, believe me, is a lot. –Peter
