WHAT I PACKED FOR MUSTER

Duckworth Men's Vapor T-Shirt

Duckworth's tee features the softest Merino wool shirt I've found and the raglan sleeves help prevent chafing under backpack straps. Bonus? Merino wool is naturally anti-odor, so it won't start to stink nearly as quickly as synthetic fibers.

DPX H.E.S.T. Knife

With super thick steel, glass breaker, G10 scales, and a bottle opener, this is the bomb shelter of knives and was perfect for everything Muster threw my way.

Alite Mantis Chair

The Mantis packs down small and light, making it easy to transport to Texas. Even though there wasn't much down time at Muster, the Mantis came in handy when we had a spare moment around the campfire.

Osprey Atmos AG 50

Many of the other attendees came with more tactical-style rucks, but I used the Osprey Atmos to transport everything to and from the event and to carry heavier loads during the Muster. Osprey's packs are always very well balanced; ideal when it's packed to the brim. The mesh suspension back panel helped my back stay dry(ish) in the hot Texas sun.

GORUCK Bullet Ruck

We had to have a "bolt bag" on us at all times during the Muster that contained all the essentials we'd need should we have to "bolt" — knife, water, food, warm clothes, lighting, and navigation equipment. The GORUCK Bullet was just big enough to fit these basics while staying small and light enough to not hold me back.
